Directions

To get to the campsite make sure that you download the instructions from treveaguecampsite.co.uk. We strongly advise against using the postcode and a satnav. In short, get to Heligan Gardens, keep going on and look for our brown tourist signs after Gorran High Lanes.

There are three beaches near by:

Gorran Haven - is a small fishing harbour with a beach, shop and quay. From the campsite turn right, walk past the cottages on left then turn left through the gate and carry on between the farmhouse and cottages. Follow the path to the right, go through the pedestrian gate on your left. Stay on this footpath down through the valley and at the bottom leave the farm via the kissing gate. Stay on the path until you meet the road, turn right and it is now a short walk to the sandy beach and harbour. Approximate time 10 minutes.

Hemmick Beach - is a sandy beach with rock pools. The beach is dog friendly. There are no facilities. Walk through the campsite past the fields until you reach the wooden gate on the road. Leave the farm here and go straight ahead down the road until you reach the beach. Approximate time 15 minutes, well sign posted.

Vault Beach - is a long, secluded beach with sand and pebbles, rock pools, and often sightings of seals and dolphins. There are no facilities. Walk through the campsite past the fields until you reach the wooden gate on the road. Turn left onto the narrow road and keep going. Go through the next gate and carry on around the bend. After a few hundred yards cut across the grass and pick up the coastal path. This will take you down to the beach. Approximate time 25 minutes.

NB. The far end of Vault Beach is a Naturist Beach.

Site rules

- **Bins** - We recycle. There are separate bins for glass, paper and cardboard. Please bring back all your rubbish from the beach and some extra if you find any discarded plastics.
- **BBQ's** are allowed, but keep them off the grass by using slabs provided in the bin area.
- **Campfire** - We allow fire pits as long as they are 2 metres away from your accommodation and you have an extinguishant/water/sand close to hand. We hire fire pits and sell wood and starter kits. Please ask at reception. No burning of rubbish creating noxious smells. We ask you burn our kiln dried firewood. No open fires. Take extra care in windy conditions and again use the paving slabs to prevent the grass being burnt.
- **Noise** - Please be considerate to others and keep the noise to a minimum after 11pm.
- **Play area** - Children must be supervised at all times (see signs).
- **Dogs** - Dogs must not be left unattended and must be kept on a lead on site. Please clear up after your dog. There are two dedicated bins one at the bin compound and one on the footpath near Hemmick field.
- **Car charging** - Cars must not be charged on pitches.
- **Speed Limit** - The speed limit on site is 5 mph.
- **Leaving site** - If you get stuck, instead of spinning your wheels, please just ask us for help. We do really need you off your pitch by 10.00am, but there is parking if you want breakfast.
- **Help** - If you need help in any way do not hesitate to ask a member of staff. We want you to have the best holiday possible.
- **Respect** - Please remember that you're not the only one on holiday. Treat others as you wish to be treated.
